Policies & Procedures

- The Troop meets every Monday night from 7:00 PM to 9:00 PM except the Monday after a campout, holidays, church or school events. All troop meetings are held in the St. John Vianney Alpha Room. Please arrive at 6:50 PM so that the meeting may start on time.
- All of our Scouts are required to wear their Scout uniform to all Troop meetings and while traveling to and from all Troop activities, such as campouts. During the summer season, Scouts may wear a Scout T-shirt (which can be purchased for \$10.00) rather than the Scout Shirt to Troop meetings. However, they are always required to wear Scout pants or shorts.
- The Scout Program Year starts on September 1st of each year and consists of: weekly Troop meetings 12 months of the year, weekend campouts 10 months of the year, a week long summer camp, community service projects, fundraisers, and other special events.
- Troop meetings are not held during school holiday or if classes have been suspended.
- **Class 1 Medical Form** – all Scouts MUST have a Class 1 Medical form on file with the Troop to attend any Campouts or Outdoor functions
- **Pocket Knives** - All Scouts under the rank of First Class must have earned their Tote'n Chip Card in order to carry a pocketknife during a campout. If a Scout is using his pocketknife at a campout he must have his Tote'n Chip card with him. If asked and he does not have the card the knife will be taken away. If a Scout does not follow the rules of using a Pocket Knife safely, he will have a corner removed from his card. After 3 corners are removed from his card, it is taken away and he must take a Tote'n Chip class again
- **BUDDY SYSTEM** – All Scouts must adhere to the buddy system while on a campout.
- **RESPECT NATURE and THE CONCEPT “Leave No Trace”** -- While camping we are to respect all that Nature has given us and not disturb any animals, plants or trees. We are also expected to adhere to the policy of Leave No Trace. The campsite must have no trace that we were there.
